

- 1-Understanding how FP7 works**
You can apply for FP7 funds by submitting a proposal following a [call published by the European Commission](#). Within FP7 you find different programmes and some of them follow different rules. Knowing and understanding these rules is key. Do not hesitate to ask us to explain FP7 to you.
- 2-Getting there needs time and resources**
Submitting a proposal needs time and you should not delay preparing until the call. We advise you to start working on your network now. When preparing a proposal as coordinator you need to expect to spend 2 man months work at least and significant travelling. As Work Package leader you should expect to spend 1 man month preparation time including travel costs and time.
- 3- Do your reading**
Every published call is accompanied by important documents. Download Work Programmes, Guide for Participants and [more](#)
- 4- Study what has been done before and by whom**


